On Thursday our District 23 Board Meeting was held. Unfortunately, our District 23 Governor, Jane Adornetto, had an accident at Melbourne Airport, resulting in her being hospitalised and requiring surgery, thankfully now, she is on the mend. Our Lieutenant Governor, Sandra Burns, stepped in and did a magnificent job during our Board Meeting and during Conference.

Much was discussed and Sandra welcomed Zonta International President Susanne von Bassewitz, who joined us for two hours in the afternoon. She asked Board members questions and discussed a variety of matters, listening and taking notes. We showed her the new District 23 brochure and discussed the colours, asking if we could keep the blue colour, synonymous with our Centenary and she suggested that we put forward a motion at our District Meeting the following day, and this resolution was subsequently passed. It was a wonderful opportunity to get her thoughts on many matters.

On completion of our Board Meeting, all four District Boards 16, 22, 23 and 24 got together at the end of the day.

That evening, Maureen Menhennet and I went for a walk along the restaurant strip where all the trees on one side of the street were lit up. Maureen found a beautiful place to eat and we met some District 23 Zontians.

There was the Welcome by District 23 Conference Chair, Erica Majba and roll call of clubs, with members standing when their club name was called.

Then the Service and Advocacy Awards were announced.





The venue for our next District 23 Conference is Bendigo and Conference 2021 will be held from the 10<sup>th</sup> – 12<sup>th</sup> September.

The newly elected members of the next District 23 Board 2020 - 2022 were elected, with Lt Governor, Sandra Burns, our next Governor-elect, Kay Stewart our Lt Governor-elect, Treasurer Lyn Symons, Area 1 Director elect, Trish McLean and Area 4 Director elect, Eloise Forbes, representing Victoria. The new Board will commence their duties after Convention in July 2020.

Our Business Sessions were completed at 3 p.m. before we were joined by Districts 16, 22 and 24 for the opening ceremony.

The Flag Ceremony is always very moving with flags representing all States and Territories of Australia, New Zealand, Zonta International, United Nations, Germany, Aboriginal, Torres Strait Islands, and Queensland Z and Golden Z clubs were placed on the stage. It was an honour and privilege for me to assist Area 1 Director, Di Hillman, carry the Victorian flag with other Area Directors carrying their State and Territory flag during the opening ceremony.

There was a spectacular Welcome to Country by Songwoman Maroochy Barambah and a traditional Maori welcome including the Haka, followed by the national anthem of Australia, sung by Loreto College Junior Choir and the national anthems of New Zealand and Germany sung by Nikky Steele, who has the most beautiful voice.

The keynote speaker was Dame Therese Walsh DNZM, current Chairman of TVNZ Ltd, Chairman of Air New Zealand and a string of other business achievements. She is also Ambassador for the Wellington Homeless Women's Trust and

convenor of the Bold Steps Conference series aimed at supporting women to achieve their full potential. She was wonderful and very witty.

Dame Therese and District 16 Governor, Souella Cumming, both started their working careers at KPMG in New Zealand and there was this continual rivalry running through Dame Therese's speech. They even wore the same dress – Dame Therese during her address and Governor Souella to the Gala Dinner the following evening, with Souella asking who wore it best? Later, she announced the vote was 50/50!

She also told a story about a farmer from Ballarat, who saw her being interviewed on Kerry O'Brien's program and he wrote to tell her he didn't think much of her. She wrote back and they became firm correspondents. When she visited Ballarat in her role as Governor-General of Australia, she visited his farm and all nine of his grandsons were dressed in suits and waving Australian flags.

Dame Quentin is very proud of the fact that she answered every letter from her time as Governor General and has just published a book, titled Dear Quentin: letters of a Governor-General.

Zonta International President and CEO, Susanne von Bassewitz, spoke about Membership in Zonta and how Zonta needs to keep pace to meet future needs of members and her rewarding work on ZI Projects. In 2012, she developed the global campaign Zonta Says No to Violence Against Women Campaign. She was very warm and it was wonderful she could attend Conference.

This was followed by the Cocktail Party, and it was a great opportunity to speak with Zontians from both countries.

Saturday began with an interview with Dame Quentin Bryce AD CVO, who spoke about her time writing her report into domestic violence, titled Not Now, Not Ever, which was commissioned by the then Queensland Premier Campbell Newman. She said the Government adopted all the recommendations from her report. One of these was establishing an Implementation Strategy and keeping the Government accountable. She said she still has grave concerns given the figures each day, are, 246 reports of domestic violence and 75 domestic violence orders are handed out. Another of her recommendations was to set up Specialist Courts to deal only with domestic violence and this has worked very well.

Next came our own Val Sarah, discussing the benefits of the Centennial Anniversary Endowment Campaign. Wouldn't it be wonderful, if, by giving a donation to this great campaign, it meant funding Zonta's projects in perpetuity?

Concurrent workshops took place, with Val attending Advocacy, Maureen attending Membership and I attended PR & Social Media, no doubt, we will hear more about these topics at our next dinner meeting.

At lunchtime, I was on duty representing District 23 at the Registration Desk. This meant answering questions about where things were and helping people, which was great fun.

Professor Megan Davis is Pro Vice-Chancellor Indigenous UNSW and a Professor of Law, UNSW Law. She spoke about the struggles the Aborigines have had and are having in their battle on constitutional reform.

Dr. Airlie Chapman gave the Amelia Earhart Fellow address and has twice received this Fellowship. She is a strong advocate for STEM education with a special interest in under-represented groups such as women and students in rural and remote areas. She spoke about space, multi copters and cooperative robotics and established the Flight Centre at Melbourne University. She discussed bridging the Gender Divide and did you know, mobile phones are designed with the size of a man's hand in mind,

seat belts are designed for men and not women, so we still have a long way to go.

At afternoon tea, I was on the District 23 table at the Marketplace, supposedly selling Zonta badges and other District 23 merchandise, however, Trish McLean had everything under control and the only constructive thing I did was get her a coffee.

Next, came a panel discussion on Ending Child Marriage with ZI President Susanne giving a presentation.

Then came the Gala Dinner with everyone dressed in their finery! It was a wonderful night with great food and great company.

Sunday began with the Ceremony of Remembrance, which was very moving! Forty Zontians were remembered and as their names were called out, their name, picture and their work in Zonta appeared on a large screen, as I said, this was very moving and inspirational.

Professor Lisa Harvey-Smith is the Australian Government's Women in STEM Ambassador and a Professor of Practice in Science Communications at UNSW Sydney. Lisa works on gender equity issues across all STEM disciplines, making the case for change and promoting the visibility of women in STEM on a national scale.

Young Women Speak Out, this was introduced by the Honourable Di Farmer, MP, Queensland Minister for Women. Did you know in Queensland 50% of members of parliament and 50% of councillors on the Brisbane City Council are women, food for thought here in Victoria! The facilitator for Young Women Speak Out was Sarah Newman, a civil and environmental engineer and in 2012, she was an International Recipient of the YWPA Award. Sarah interviewed the District winners of the YWPA Award for 2018; District 16 was Sara Khatua, District 22 was Madison Birchnell, District 23 was Hibra Shujaat and District 24 was Jorga Attard, they spoke about gender equality and projects they are passionate about in their communities.

Emma Beale, who is the 2018 Zonta International Jane M Klausman Recipient, is in her third year of study in the Bachelor of Advanced Finance and Economics (Honours) program at the University of Queensland. She hopes that the skills she learns at university will help her to one day aid economic growth and development in impoverished and oppressed nations, a passion she has held since spending time living in orphanages and refugee camps on the Thai-Burma border.

Throughout Conference, presentations were made to Past International Presidents, and our own Val Sarah was one of these stars. Other PIP's were Leneen Forde who was ZI President from 1990-1992, Val was ZI President from 1998-2000, Mary Magee was ZI President from 2000-2002 and Lynn McKenzie from New Zealand was ZI President from 2012-2014

The Centennial Anniversary Awards were given out with Julia Gillard being Australia's recipient and Marilyn Waring receiving the award for New Zealand.

Then ZI President Suzanne invited everyone to attend Convention in Chicago in July 2020, which should be an amazing event.


